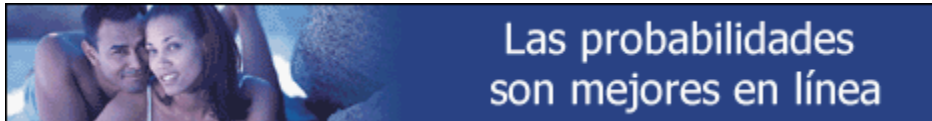

Dear Mr Cross,

Thank you for your enquiry regarding your great great grandfather John Cross.

There are two entrance forms for Cross. The first tells us that he entered the Theological Department of King's College London on 9 February 1850 aged twenty-two. The date of his last birthday was 19 July 1849. Cross was admitted to the the Class of Candidates, a preparatory class for those who were not yet qualified to pass the examination for admission into the Theological Department. His residence in London is given as Student's Chambers. He paid tuition fees of thirteen pounds and three shillings. The second entrance form states that Cross entered the third class of the Theological Department on 7 July 1851 aged twenty-three. His student address is given as Theological Residences and he paid twelve pounds and twelve shillings tuition fees. Unfortunately the entrance forms of this period do not give any information regarding the student's birthplace, schooling or parental address.

Cross is listed in the College Calendars as a registered student of the Theological Department from 1850 to 1853. He was a matriculated student of the Department from 1851 to 1853. He was awarded a Certificate and became an Associate of King's College in 1853.

I hope that this is of use to you and wish you well with your research.
